Solicitor's Report for May 15, 2023

Requests for legislation

1. Resolution honoring Alexander J. Turner an employee of O'Reilly Auto Parts for his clear thinking and bravery on May 5, 2023. After hearing gunshots outside his store he ordered the customers in the store to the back, away from the windows and went to lock the front door. He saw two children out in the parking lot. Without hesitation, he ran into the parking lot, while shots were still being fired, grabbed a five-year-old child and brought them into the store to safety. He then went back outside to help fellow employee Catherine Munger to save an infant who was in their car seat in the parking lot. When the shooter came in his direction, he told the shooter to stop because there were children here. Then he followed Ms. Munger into the store and locked the front door.
2. Resolution honoring Catherine Munger, an employee of O'Reilly Auto Parts for her clear thinking and bravery on May 5, 2023. She was at the counter with a customer when she heard gunshots outside. She looked out the window and saw a man with a gun in the parking lot shooting into a car. She also directed customers and team members to the back of the store. As she was calling 911, a customer told her there were children outside. She followed Mr. Turner into the parking lot and saw an infant in a car. She went past the shooter and removed the child from its car seat as Mr. Turner spoke to the shooter. She brought the infant into the store to safety.
3. Resolution honoring Patrolman Logan Nickles of the Ashtabula Police Department. Patrolman Nickles and Patrolman Mark Allen both arrived at O'Reilly Auto Parts at approximately the same time on Friday, May 4, 2023, in response to a call of shots fired. Patrolman Allen went in search of a victim who was believed to be on West 47th Street. Patrolman Nickles stayed in the parking lot. He exited his vehicle and began surveying the area trying to determine what had happened. He saw a female seriously injured in a car in the parking lot. While checking for any vital signs and assessing what first aid assistance he could provide, he radioed for an ambulance. He then heard people yelling at him about the shooter. He turned to the man the witnesses had pointed out and asked if he was armed. The man confirmed he was. Officer Nickles then placed the man in handcuffs and with the assistance of Officer Allen, who had returned to the scene, safely retrieved the firearm and ammunition from the suspect, thus ending the threat.
